

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's, Brunton Park

Sunday 2nd June 2024 Corpus Christi

This Sunday we're marking the feast of Corpus Christi. It's a day that gives thanks for the meal of the church that we share. And as we mark this day, perhaps we're reminded that Holy Communion points us in two directions: to communion with God, and communion with one another.

In John's Gospel, we see the first as Jesus says: 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever.' And later: 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them.' When we eat this bread and wine, as they become for us Jesus' own flesh and blood, we're eating the very life of heaven, and abiding in Christ. We share in deep and profound communion with God.

Equally in Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we see the other dimension as he says: 'Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.' For all the flaws and fickleness of the church – and Paul certainly knew about those when he was writing to the Corinthians – this meal binds us to one another with an incredible strength. We become one body as we share in one bread. We are part of one another. We share in communion, not only with God but with those around us. Both of these are worth giving thanks for whenever we receive this Holy Communion.

1 Corinthians 10.16-17, 11.23-26

The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.

I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

John 6.51-58

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.'

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.'
