

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Brunton Park

Sunday 20th October 2024 Trinity 21

Today's gospel reading concludes our journey over the last six weeks through the central section of Mark's gospel, starting in Galilee with Peter's acknowledgement of Jesus as Messiah and ending today on the approach to Jerusalem. In contrast to Jesus' public ministry in the first part of Mark's gospel, with its numerous miracles and teaching of the crowds, this section concentrates on Jesus' private teaching of his disciples: what it means for him to be a servant Messiah and what that means for them as his followers.

The disciples really don't get it. They don't just misunderstand Jesus, they get it wrong in what they say and do, spectacularly so in the case of James and John in today's gospel, though the rest of the twelve in their response don't do much better.

It's easy for us with hindsight to be critical of the disciples, and almost as easy to recognise that down the centuries Jesus' followers – individual Christians and the Church as an institution – have often got it just as spectacularly wrong. Rather less easy to acknowledge that those of us who read Mark today still get it wrong. It is not so among you' is a message not just to the twelve and to Mark's church but to all who follow him. But we're in good company when we fail or make mistakes as disciples of Jesus. The good news is that he doesn't give up on us and wants to restore and use us, however often we get it wrong.

Hebrews 5:1-10

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

'You are my Son,

today I have begotten you';

as he says also in another place,

'You are a priest for ever,

according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'
