Sunday 17th November 2024 Second before Advent

Remembrance Sunday feels a strange contrast to last Sunday's celebration of All Saints Day, when we gave thanks that the light of God conquers darkness. On the eve of the First World War, the British Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey told a friend; "The lamps are going out all over Europe, we shall not see them lit again in our lifetime". In this season of celebrating the light of heaven, we stop to remember the suffering, the sacrifice, the darkness of war. But Remembrance Sunday isn't only about remembering these dark times in the past. It is also an invitation to think again about the future. Our readings from scripture focus on this opportunity to think differently. They are both passages about a change of path, a response to God's call to repent. To our ears, 'repentance' can sound an odd, outdated word. But in the Bible 're-pent' simply means 'turn back' or 'think again'. On Remembrance Sunday, we recall the suffering, the sacrifice, the darkness that war brings, and we also look for the light. We take the time to repent, to change course, to commit to a future of peace.

Daniel 12.1-3

In the third year of King Cyrus a word was revealed to Daniel. 'At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.'

Mark 13.1-8

As Jesus came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, 'Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!' Then Jesus asked him, 'Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.'

When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will

be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?' Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.'
