Sunday 3rd November 2024 All Saints

This Sunday marks the feast of All Saints. It's a time to remember all those who have gone before us. Those who have run the race faithfully and received their crown of glory. Wherever we find ourselves in that race we can look to the Saints for inspiration and encouragement. So this morning we ask together what it is that makes a Saint. The church has recognised many of them but the line of saints stretches far further than those who are remembered with St before their name.

Our reading from Revelation 21 offers a picture of the final beauty of heaven, where Christ sits on the throne and wipes every tear from our eyes. Where death and mourning and crying are no more. Perhaps we could see the Saints as those who caught seen a glimpse of the beauty of that heavenly vision, who have let it fill their lives, and who have overflowed with it as they live out the grace of the heavenly kingdom in the world. Perhaps we can also ask whether we want to join the ranks of the Saints, filled to overflowing with Christ's loving grace.

'Oh how I want to be in the number, when the saints go marching in.'

Revelation 21.1-6

I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'See, the home of God is among mortals.

He will dwell with them;

they will be his peoples,

and God himself will be with them;

he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Death will be no more;

mourning and crying and pain will be no more,

for the first things have passed away.'

And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true.' Then he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.'

John 11.32-44

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, 'Where have you laid him?' They said to him, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?'

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, 'Take away the stone.' Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, 'Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days.' Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and said, 'Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me.' When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'
