

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Brunton Park Sunday 15th December 2024 Advent 3

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as 'Gaudete' Sunday, which means 'Rejoice'. The pink candle is lit on our Advent wreath not in memory of Mary, a common misconception, but she's next week, but instead for the call to 'rejoice'. The name comes from the traditional introit to the Third Sunday of Advent, taken from Paul's letter to the Philippians: 'Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice.'

So in these weeks leading up to Christmas, a great festival of rejoicing, what do you have to rejoice in? For some the answer to that question may spring immediately to mind, for others Christmas is a much more complicated time, and carries as much sorrow as joy. Paul's words are not only for times when rejoicing comes easily, they are written from hardship and persecution, and yet turn to God in praise. So, whether your rejoicing feels easy or hard, what do you want to offer thanks for? What gift of God's provision, or presence, or peace do you want to rejoice in, as we prepare to welcome the Christ-child this Christmas?

Zephaniah 3.14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The LORD has taken away the judgements against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing as on a day of festival.

I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the LORD

Luke 3.7-18

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.'

And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even tax-collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.' As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.
