

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Brunton Park Sunday 1st December 2024 Advent 1

Perhaps the 1st December fills you with happy anticipation - parties, Christmas lights, cosy evenings with loved ones. Or perhaps it fills you with anxiety - to-do lists, loneliness, extra expenses. Whichever camp you're in – excited, or anxious, or somewhere in-between – the season of Advent is here to offer us a different perspective. Over these few weeks we join a story which is much bigger than us. And on this first Sunday of Advent in particular, we're invited to lift our heads above the noise and glitter and adverts, and look to the future with hope. You'd think that if we were counting down to Christmas, our readings from the Bible each week would be follow the events leading up to the birth of Jesus. But our advent readings mess with that chronology. They run backwards, beginning at the end.

In this week's gospel reading we hear Jesus speaking to his disciples near the end of his time on earth, and the topic of conversation is the end of the world. He is speaking to reassure them: many chaotic and traumatic things are going to happen. But don't give in to fear, and don't let the everyday worries of life drag you down. Instead, keep watch for me. I'll be back soon, and then everything will be put right.

Why are we preparing to celebrate a birth that happened 2000 years ago by thinking about the apocalypse? Because the story of Christmas isn't just about a nice thing from the past. It's also a story that promises hope for the future. We are invited to walk into the future backwards: God has come to be with his people before, and he will come to be with his people again.

Jeremiah 33.14-16

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfil the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness.'

Luke 21.25-36

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'
