

St Aidan's Brunton Park Sunday 8th December 2024 Advent 2

The second Sunday of Advent, as we continue our countdown to Christmas, looks back to the Prophets of Old. The prophets task was, in part, to prepare people for the coming of God. As we hear their words today, and as we prepare to celebrate God's coming in flesh at Christmas, we might ask how exactly to prepare. Our reading from Malachi offers a striking image, that of the refiner's fire. Malachi says that God is like the fire that takes raw ore, full of impurities, encased in useless material – called dross – and burns that away to allow pure gold and silver to be poured out.

Perhaps as we prepare for Christmas we might hear in these words a call to allow God to do the same work within us. It's a hard task, to be purified by the refiners fire means allowing parts of us to be burned away. It means the allowing the useless clutter that so often accumulates around our hearts and our lives, to be let go of. But at the end of it, we will find ourselves with something as pure and beautiful as gold. Perhaps, particularly with all the clutter that comes with Christmas, this is a chance to let God refine away the dross, and leave us with the pure gold of his presence in Christ.

Malachi 3.1-4

Thus says the Lord God: See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

Luke 3.1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord,

make his paths straight.

Every valley shall be filled,

and every mountain and hill shall be made low,

and the crooked shall be made straight,

and the rough ways made smooth;

and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."
