

Team Parish of Christ the King St Aidan's Brunton Park Sunday 12th January 2025 Baptism of Christ

This Sunday we remember the Baptism of Christ, the moment that is the springboard to Jesus' public ministry after 30 years of living a quiet life with his parents in Nazareth. It's also a chance for Christians to remember their own baptism, whenever and wherever that was, and to remember what it means for us.

Baptism is the moment in which we inherit the fulness of our identity as children of God. Just as God speaks to Jesus and says: 'You are my Son; the Beloved, with you I am well pleased' so we hear those words spoken also to us. Through Christ, in the moment of our baptism, God says to each of us: 'You are my child, my beloved, I am pleased with you.' Those are words that we carry through the rest of our lives. We take them through every trial and challenge. They hold us through every moment of joy and celebration. With these words, of course, comes the weight of a calling to live as God desires his children to live. But it also comes with the promise of the unconditional love of our heavenly Father, who will never stop loving us. So on this feast of the Baptism of Christ, hear these words once again spoken by God to you: 'You are my child, my beloved, I am pleased with you.'

Isaiah 43.1-7

1Thus says the LORD,
he who created you, O Jacob,
he who formed you, O Israel:
Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name, you are mine.
2When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;
and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;
when you walk through fire you shall not be burned,
and the flame shall not consume you.
3For I am the LORD your God,
the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.
I give Egypt as your ransom,
Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you.
4Because you are precious in my sight,

and honoured, and I love you,
I give people in return for you,
nations in exchange for your life.
5Do not fear, for I am with you;
I will bring your offspring from the east,
and from the west I will gather you;
6I will say to the north, 'Give them up',
and to the south, 'Do not withhold;
bring my sons from far away
and my daughters from the end of the earth –
7everyone who is called by my name,
whom I created for my glory,
whom I formed and made.'

Luke 3.15-17,21,22

(In the wilderness John proclaimed a baptism of repentance.) As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'
