Sunday 16th March 2025 Lent 2

Our two Bible readings today are not exactly full of the joys of spring. But it is Lent, so what do we expect? They are both set in the context of a journey, but what also links them is lament. Abram laments what seem to be God's unfulfilled promises; Jesus laments the state of Jerusalem. But lament in the Bible is not the same thing as being sad and sorrowful, and certainly not the same as feeling sorry for oneself or for what one has done. It's more a form of prayer. Over one-third of the psalms are classed as laments, like Psalm 13 with its opening phrase 'How long, O Lord?' And lament takes it as read that God is there, hears one's cry, and has the power to turn that which is lamentable into something better; it focusses not on the individual but on the situation that is a matter of concern and places it in God's hands. Psalm 13 concludes 'I trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation.'

Gerard reminded us last week that the forty days and nights of Lent (not counting the Sundays) constitute a journey. As we journey though Lent, what situations in our own lives, in the church or in the world do we lament, and how might we place them in God's hands?

Genesis 15.1-12, 17-18

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then he said to him, 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying

each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'

Luke 13.31-end

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, 'Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you.' He said to them, 'Go and tell that fox for me, "Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed away from Jerusalem." Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord."'
