This year on Passion Sunday, we'll also be celebrating Safeguarding Sunday. To tie those two themes together we're lucky to have Dr Sarah Troughton offer her creative reflections and artwork following Jesus' journey to the cross. Safeguarding, and the church's failure to protect or deal justly with survivors of abuse, has been much in the news over recent months. It led the Archbishop's resignation, and to continuing debate in General Synod.

This week is a chance to prayerfully reflect on how we might hear the story of Jesus' passion as it speaks to both individuals and the church, reminding us of the Christ who suffers abuse at the hands of others in solidarity with all those who have faced the same in their lives, and even in his Church.
